- The EPC to compare the un-subsidised cost of connection in the various NRI member states;
- ii) That the EPC in collaboration with the other portfolio committees to provide guidance on how the surpluses can be utilised by member states;
- iii) EPC to consider analysing the generation cost in various countries from IPPs and state-owned utilities with a view of coming up with a harmonised generation tariff;
- iv) The demand-supply balance to break down the planned projects by technology to provide insights into the regional reserve margin and enable the member states to align their energy requirements accordingly.
- v) As a follow up to the electric mobility concept note, the EPC to prioritise the review of standards related to health, safety and environment before looking into regulations and policies.
- vi) EPC to benchmark the Electric Vehicle framework with European and other countries which have such frameworks in place;
- vii) Electricity Regulatory Outcome Index to be analysed further to come up with recommendations on how the region can improve.
- viii) The Secretariat to organise a workshop where the technocrats in the region can meet and share knowledge based on the ERI results.

- iv) NRI heads should sensitise their respective ministers on EREA anchorage before the next EAC sectoral meeting; and
- v) In the next meeting in Arusha, the EXCO to consider visiting the East African Community to formally introduce EREA.
