There were no conflicts of interest declared by the members in the business of the meeting.

MIN 5. EXCO/24/22: INTRODUCTION AND OPENING REMARKS.

The Heads of Delegation of AREEN, EWURA, EPRA, ERA, ZURA, PAU, PURA and RURA introduced themselves and the members of their delegations.

The Chair, Eng. Emilie Patrick BAGANIZI welcomed the members physically present at the meeting in Kigali, Rwanda as well as those attending virtually and made his opening remarks. In his remarks, the Chair appreciated the AGA members present for honouring EREA with their visit. He lauded the EXCO members for their attendance and the EREA secretariat and secretariat bureau for organizing the EREA 24th EXCO meeting. He also appreciated the portfolio committees for their work over the last one week.

The chair noted the growth of EREA since its establishment 13 years ago and increasing in membership from four (4) to nine (9) members. He noted the great developments in the East African Community (EAC) energy sector including a significant increase in electricity access rate in the region, gas extraction in Tanzania and Rwanda, implementation of regional power interconnection projects, creation of a power pool for our region, discovery of oil in Uganda and Kenya. He observed that the energy sector in the EAC region has faced various challenges notably, the Covid-19 Pandemic and the Russia- Ukraine war. The chair noted major developments in EREA in capacity building such as the Energy

Regulation Centre of Excellence (ERCE) and appreciated the EREA secretariat and the secretariat bureau for that milestone.

In conclusion, the chair urged the EREA members to come together and think collectively to improve the EAC energy sector.

MIN 10. EXCO/24/22: PRESENTATION OF PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE REPORTS

10.1. EXCO/24/22: ECONOMIC PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE (EPC)

The Economic Portfolio Committee (EPC) presented its progress implementation report for financial year 2022/23.

The EXCO;

NOTED

That the EPC report had improved and commended the EPC.

APPROVED and **ADOPTED** the EPC report.

DIRECTED the EPC to;

- i) Compile issues that EXCO should action and recommend to the AGA;
- ii) Determine standardized connection costs for No- pole and one-pole to form benchmarks;
- iii) Determine Renewable Energy Feed-in Tariffs indicative tariffs which will be reviewed annually as benchmarks to be used by NRIs;
- iv) Include Ethiopia-Kenya in the regional energy exchange analysis;
- v) To consider other factors that affect the generation costs besides the feed-in-tariffs e.g. In Uganda, power plants above 10MW revert to the government after the lapse of the Power Purchase Agreement;
- vi) To include a section on emerging issues and trends in the energy sector globally and among member states;

10.2. EXCO/24/22: LEGAL PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE(LPC)

The Legal Portfolio Committee (LPC) presented its progress implementation report for financial year 2022/23.

The EXCO;

NOTED;

i) On the matter of sustainability, there is need to have clarity on how the three institutions that is EREA, ERCE and the Independent Regulatory Board(IRB) will exist and be resourced;

- ii) That the EREA has a much wider scope than IRB in terms of mandate as it incorporates oil and gas;
- iii) That there is need to physically locate the ERCE and consider getting support from NRIs in instances where the training venue is to rotate among the member states;
- iv) EWURA's commitment to work with the EREA secretariat to obtain land for the construction of the ERCE in Arusha, Tanzania;
- v) The Draft Energy Data Repository Guidelines for further comments by the portfolio committees;
- vi) The status of registration of the EREA as an association under the Societies Act Cap. 337 of Laws of Tanzania.

ADOPTED the LPC report.

APPROVED;

- i) The Questionnaire for the EREA Petroleum Regulatory Index for onwards submission to the Petroleum Portfolio Committee (PPC);
- ii) The Terms of Engagement for Experts at the ERCE;
- iii) The Gender mainstreaming comparative analysis template for onwards submission to the NRI's.

DIRECTED

- i) The Secretariat to submit an application to the National Council for Technical and Vocational Educational Training (NACVET) for registration of EREA Centre of Excellence in line with the Laws of Tanzania;
- ii) The EREA and IRB should remain as separate entities;
- iii) The secretariat should fast-track the operationalization of the ERCE after completing the registration of EREA under the Societies Act Cap. 337 of Laws of Tanzania;

iv) To include a section on emerging issues and trends in the energy sector globally and among member states;

10.3. EXCO/24/22: PETROLEUM PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE(PPC)

The Petroleum Portfolio Committee (PPC) presented its progress implementation report for financial year 2022/23.

The EXCO;

NOTED the progress of implementation of the various PPC activities

for financial year 2022/23;

APPROVED and **ADOPTED** the Petroleum Portfolio Committee report.

DIRECTED the PPC to;

- i) Undertake research and benchmarking on best practices in petroleum price regulation among the member states;
- ii) Undertake a regional analysis on security of supply in the areas of strategic stocks and leveraging on National Oil Companies to stabilize the market; and
- iii) To include a section on emerging issues and trends in the energy sector globally and among member states.

10.4. EXCO/24/22: ELECTRICITY AND RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE (EREPC)

The Electricity and Renewable Energy Portfolio Committee presented its progress implementation report for financial year 2022/23.

The EXCO;

NOTED the progress of implementation of the various EREPC activities.

APPROVED and **ADOPTED** the EREPC report.

DIRECTED the EREPC to;

- i) Coordinate with EPC and propose recommendations for implementation by NRIs emanating from the demand and supply balance analysis;
- ii) The proposed trainings to be offered under the ERCE as a way of addressing practical challenges in the EAC region;
- iii) Undertake a review of the energy market in the region and propose a more structured approach;
- iv) Undertake an analysis of regional energy mix and report on the proportion of renewable energy sources and non-renewable energy sources and proposals on transitioning to cleaner energy;
- v) Include a section on emerging issues and trends in the energy sector globally and among member states;
