MIN 5. EXCO/26/23: INTRODUCTION AND OPENING REMARKS.

The Chairperson of EXCO welcomed the Heads of Delegations of ARE, AREEN, EWURA, EPRA, ERA, PAU, PURA, and RURA to introduce themselves and the members of their delegations. The chairperson also recognized the presence of the Lead Coordinator of the IRB.

The Chairperson, Eng. Ziria Tibalwa Waako welcomed the members present at the meeting in Entebbe, Uganda and made her opening remarks. In her remarks, the Chairperson lauded the Petroleum Authority of Uganda (PAU) for hosting the 26th EXCO meeting which was opened by the Hon. Minister of State for Energy, Uganda. She commended the EREA secretariat for its efforts in sourcing alternative funding and the establishment of the Energy Regulation Centre of Excellence (ERCE) noting that over 300 energy experts in the EAC region have been trained to date. The Chairperson also recognized the need to urgently establish the ERCE on the land that was allocated in the United Republic of Tanzania. She emphasized and encouraged the members to promptly remit their annual subscriptions to facilitate the efficient operation of the EREA secretariat. In this regard, she underscored the need for members to mainstream EREA activities and budget in their respective institutional annual work plans. She noted that there are several regional organizations in the EAC with distinct mandates and the importance of the members to be sensitized on the distinctions and their respective benefits. The chairperson further commended the PCs for working tirelessly implementing planned activities, including implementation of action plans, directives of EXCO, AGA, and progress in implementing the ERCE and the various funding options for constructing the centre.

In closing the chairperson appreciated the member NRIs for their commitment to EREA as demonstrated by their participation in the 26th EXCO and encouraged them to remain firm in steering the EAC region.
